

János Fodor was born 1975 in Hungary and lives and works in Berlin. 2004 he graduated from the Intermedia Department of the University of Fine Arts in Budapest. Solo shows include: Kisterem (Budapest, 2011), Art Cologne, L.A. Galerie Frankfurt (Köln 2010), Lada Projekte (Berlin 2008), Künstlerhaus Bethanien (Berlin 2006). Selected group exhibitions include: Emperor's new cloth, Trafo (Budapest 2013), Report on the Construction of A Spaceship Module, New Museum (New York City, 2014), Haunting Monumentality, Gallery Plan-B (Berlin 2012), Listing, Kisterem (Budapest 2011), Never Odd or Even, Grimmuseum (Berlin 2011), Kalifornia, Trafó Gallery, (Budapest 2011), Malkasten (Düsseldorf 2010), Solyt, SAIR/VAK (Denmark 2009), Pampero Apartments (Berlin 2008), Imaginary Paradises, Foto Rio, Parc des Ruínas (Rio de Janeiro 2007), Bucharest Biennale 2 (Romania 2006).


The solo exhibition *Overmorrow* by Hungarian artist János Fodor gives, with over 100 works created between 1997 and 2014, a comprehensive overview of his practice. The multitude of works highlights the whole range of Fodor's themes and formal methods: Through objects, sculptures, photographs, prints and painting his interest for cultural phenomena is expressed. Thus, everyday objects and consumer goods are part of his work and often appear as "readymades with a twist": a Duplo bar is transformed into a glass object (2.16), juice brand "Dole" becomes "Idol" (42) and chopsticks are modified into paint brushes (32). In addition, there are noticeable allusions to Pop-Art, especially when Fodor picks up the chorus of the 80's hit "Wonderful Life" by Black in the form of drinking straws (45) or relates to Disneyland

through a slightly changed version of its slogan inscribed into marble (9). To be sure, most of Fodor's works contain references to cultural assets with historical, artistic, or scientific relevance. With "Dark Square" (6) Fodor revives Kazimir Malevich's "Black Square" and also explores its formal flexibility. Astronomical appearances are depicted in two circular works; one shows the dark side of the moon (16), the other is a map of the oldest light of the universe (15). In Fodor's works ordinary objects are distorted, the functional is made dysfunctional and the familiar becomes twisted. Hence, the exhibition will present a collection that is dedicated to Fodor's idea of "finding better questions to well-known answers".


Die Einzelausstellung *Overmorrow* des ungarischen Künstlers János Fodor gibt als Werkschau mit über 100 Werken, die zwischen 1997 und 2014 entstanden sind, einen umfassenden Überblick über sein Schaffen. Durch die Vielzahl der präsentierten Arbeiten wird sein gesamtes inhaltliches und formales Spektrum verdeutlicht: In Objekten, Skulpturen, Fotografien, Drucken und Malerei drückt sich sein Interesse für kulturelle Phänomene aus. Alltagsgegenstände und Konsumgüter finden Eingang in sein Schaffen und offenbaren sich als „readymades with a twist“: ein Duplo-Riegel wird vergläsert (2.16), der Safthersteller „Dole“ wird zu „Idol“ (42) und chinesische Essstäbchen zu Pinseln umfunktioniert (32). Auch Verweise auf die Pop-Art werden deutlich, besonders wenn der Refrain des 80er Jahre Hits „Wonderful life“ von Black in Form von Strohhalmen aufgegriffen wird (45) oder auf Disneyland und dessen Slogan in leicht veränderter Weise Bezug genommen wird (9). Zudem bestehen in vielen Arbeiten Referenzen zu Kulturgütern mit geschichtlicher, künstlerischer oder wissenschaftlicher Relevanz. Mit „Dark Square“ (6) nimmt Fodor das „Das Schwarze Quadrat“ von Kasimir Malewitsch auf und deckt zugleich dessen formale Flexibilität auf. Astronomische Erscheinungen tauchen unter anderem in den beiden kreisrunden Arbeiten „Dark Side of the Moon“ (16) und „Oldest Light“ (15) auf; einmal die Darstellung der dunklen Seite des Mondes und zum anderen eine Himmelskarte des ältesten Lichtes. In Fodors Arbeiten wird das scheinbar Bekannte verfremdet, das Funktionale dysfunktional gemacht und gewohnte Gegenstände verzerrt. Damit entsteht mit der Ausstellung ein Sammelsurium, das sich Fodors Leitgedanken widmet: „Finding better questions for well-known answers.“




